Second Competitor Named for WorldSkills Cabinetmaking Qualifying Trial at AWFS®Fair

COMMERCE, Calif – July 6, 2011 -- Kaydee Walters, a student from Tooele High School in Tooele, Utah, will face 2010 Gold Medalist Daniel Berrios, from Bethlehem Vo-Tech School in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, In the WorldSkills Cabinetmaking Qualifying Trial at the AWFS Fair July 20 – 23 in Las Vegas. The winner will represent the United States at the 2013 WorldSkills competition in Germany.

Walters won the Gold Medal for High School Cabinetmaking at the SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference in Kansas City, Missouri last month.

Berrios and Walters will compete at the WorldSkills booth in the Central Hall Wednesday - Friday of the show, building a project to showcase their cabinet construction and woodworking skills. Two industry professionals will judge the students' work, Saúl Martin from Architectural Woodworking Company, Los Angeles, California, and Charles Wilson from Charles Wilson Millworks, Cedar City, Utah, will score the students' skills and processes. The winner will be announced on Saturday morning at 11 a.m. at the WorldSkills booth.
