Students Receive Recognition at AWFS Fair Awards Ceremony;

Students from Schools New to Fresh Wood Take Home Contest's Top Honors

LAS VEGAS – (July 21, 2017) – Cody Campanie, a student at Seattle Central College won The Best of Show Award, in the 2017 AWFS® Fresh Wood Competition after judges reviewed the projects of 41 finalists from 16 different high schools and colleges in the U.S. and Canada at the 2017 AWFS® Fair in Las Vegas, Nevada. Twenty-seven students went home with monetary prizes ranging from \$250 to \$1,000, along with trophies and software prizes

Campanie was awarded an iconic sculpture made by renowned woodworker and artist Garry Knox Bennett, for his project *Azulejos Table*. He received \$1,000 and he, his school, and his instructor received KCD Software Packages. He also received First Place in the Post Secondary Tables category of the competition, which included another \$1,000 prize and a Certificate of Merit. The Best of Show award is sponsored by KCD Software.

Fair attendees awarded the People's Choice Award, sponsored by Wagner Meters, and a \$750 prize to Sarah Provard of West Jordan High School (Utah), for her *Musically Inclined* cabinet with themed inlay, which also won First Place in the High School Case Goods category.

For both students, this was the first time that students from their schools were finalists in Fresh Wood. In addition, six schools received awards for multiple projects: Art Center College of Design (CA); Center for Furniture Craftsmanship (ME); College of the Redwoods (CA); Corner Canyon High School (UT); Palomar College (UT); Princeton Day School (NJ).

The Fresh Wood 2017 judging panel - consisting of Jena Hall (Jena Hall Designs Ltd.), Tom McKenna (*Fine Woodworking Magazine*), Chris Poehlmann (CP Lighting), Mei-Yen Shipek (Autodesk Pier 9), Scott Vasey (Advanced Fixtures Inc.) - provided a variety of perspectives to the judging process.

First Place winners in each category and at each school level received a \$1,000 prize, Second Place winners received \$500 and Honorable Mention winners received \$250. AWFS covers project shipping and the majority of travel and hotel costs to bring the students and their teachers to Las Vegas.

The biennial event, held as part of <u>AWFS®Fair</u>, attracted a near-record 195 entries from schools in the United States and Canada in 2017, which represents a 13% increase in entries from the previous competition in 2015.
