

- Invite your school's career counselor as well!





- Top 40+ finalists projects on display at the AWFS Fair



# AAW Turning to the Future student woodturning competition

- Hosted by the American Association of Woodturners (AAW)
- Similar guidelines as Fresh Wood; entry deadline May 1, 2019
- Projects must be smaller than 20" in diameter and at least partially turned on a lathe
